Installing the Drivers

Turn on the computer and Insert the D-Link DWL-G650M Driver CD in the CD-ROM drive.

The step-by-step instructions that follow are shown in **Windows XP**. The steps and screens are similar for Windows 2000.

Do NOT install the DWL-G650M Notebook Adapter into your computer before installing the driver software from the D-Link CD!



If the CD Autorun function does not automatically start on your computer, type "D:\Drivers\setup.exe." If it does start, proceed to the next screen.








Installing the DWL-G650M Wireless Notebook Adapter in Your Laptop

- C. Gently insert the DWL-G650M into the Cardbus slot in your laptop computer as shown below.






Completing the Installation



WPA-PSK:


WPA-Personal is directed at home users who do not have the server based equipment required for user authentication. The method of authentication is similar to WEP because you define a "Pre-Shared Key" on the wireless router/AP. Once the pre-shared key is confirmed and satisfied on both the client and access point, then access is granted. the encryption method used is referred to as the Temporal Key Integrity Protocol (TKIP), which offers per-packet dynamic hashing. It also includes an integrity checking feature which ensures that the packets were not tampered with during wireless transmission.


- Status: Displays the MAC Address of the Access Point that is associated with the DWL-G650M.
- **SSID:** The Service Set Identifier is the name assigned to the wireless network. The factory SSID setting is set to **default**.
- **TxRate:** The default setting is **Auto**; meaning, TxRate settings are automatically determined by the DWL-G650M depending on the distance from the access point.
- **Channel:** Displays the channel information. By default, the channel is set to 6 and selection is automatically determined by the DWL-G650M.
- Link Quality / Signal Strength: Displays the Link Quality for the DWL-G650M wireless connection to the access point. The Signal Strength represents the wireless signal between the access point and the DWL-G650M. The percentage coincides with the graphical bar.
- Data Rate: Graphically displays the statistics of data transmitted and received.




- SSID: The Service Set Identifier is the name assigned to the wireless network. The factory SSID setting is set to default. Make changes here to match the SSID on existing Wireless Router or Access Point.
- Wireless Mode: The factory setting is set to Infrastructure. Ad-Hoc mode is used for peer-to-peer networking.
- AdHoc Band: Specifies the Ad-Hoc Band used whether 802.11b/g when setting up an Ad-Hoc network.
- **Channel:** By default, the channel is set to **6**. Channel selection is automatically adjusted by the DWL-G650M depending on the channel setting of the access point selected for association. To change the channel settings, the **Wireless Mode** must be set to **Ad-hoc**.
- TxRate: You can adjust the transmission rate to get the best signal possible depending on your usage and your environment.
- Power Mode: By default, Power Mode is set to Continuous Access Mode.
 - **Continuous Access Mode** this default setting consumes the most power.
 - **Maximum Power Save** this setting consumes the least power.
 - **Power Save** this setting consumes a moderate amount of power.
- Support Band: By default, the DWL-G650M will scan & connect to an 802.11b/g network.
